This annual stability program, presented to the Parliament (October N-1) within the scope of Economic, Social and Financial Rapport, contains some estimates of aggregate level of expenditures. Economic, Social and Financial <i>Rapport</i> is annexed to Executive's Budget Proposal.  See also Article 50 of Constitutional bylaw N° 2001-692 of 1 August 2001 on budget acts.</p> <p><b><u>Peer Reviewer One Comment:</u></b> Contrary to the comment, a multi-year period presentation exists in the executive’s budget proposal. This presentation takes place in the chapter “Les grandes orientations de finances publiques.”</p> <p><b><u>Peer Reviewer Two Comment:</u></b></p> <p><b><u>Researcher Response:</u></b> Peer Reviewer One is correct. The chapter “les grandes orientations des finances publiques” estimates the aggregate level of expenditure presented for a multi-year period.</p>	a

It might be argued that it is “b,” (as Unemployment Care might be). Answer “e” can be avoided as Social Security is a usual Extra-Budgetary Fund (EBF), so it is very comparable to the situation in other countries (the real specificity is that this particular EBF is ruled by very strict procedures, precisely for the sake of transparency). However, it should be noted that the research literature distinguishes between several types of EBFs which raise quite different concerns in term of transparency. Answer “d” should be avoided. Although the Social Security budget follows a special procedure, it is very largely documented and shows the exact same high standards of transparency as the general budget. **Researcher's Response to this Question was "a."**

**Peer Reviewer One Comment:** A more appropriate response to this question would be "b."

The question is about information which is more highly disaggregated than that which appears in the executive's budget. The comment of the researcher concerns a website where only the executive budget is available. Moreover, in practice, not all expenditures could be asked with a high degree of details.

**Peer Reviewer Two Comment:** I agree with "a."

It seems to me that the webpage linked by the researcher is very clear, even if it suffers from two small weaknesses :

-1- It is only available in French. The question of multilingual documentation is specifically addressed in tables 3 and 4 (line 8).

-2- The vocabulary may be misleading to a newcomer, as it is organized around three keywords: "missions" (the most general level of functional classification, see question 2), "programs" (the more detailed level of functional classification) and "ministères." But first those keywords are the very basis of the organization of the French budget (following LOLF reform in 2006). Second, there is indeed a clear and accessible glossary (last link in the grey right-hand column, "Ressources documentaires > Glossaire," on that very page).

**Researcher Response:** This website is the official government website for finances. These documents are official and approved by parliament. You can find all details except for security. We maintain response "a."

**IBP Comment:** IBP editors chose answer, "a" to maintain consistency with the criteria used for selecting answers across countries.
