- Access to adequate water has deteriorated in Emalahleni, Emfuleni and Witzenberg.
- There is still no sanitation provided by the municipalities in Emalahleni, Emfuleni and Msunduzi.
- Residents from Madibeng joined Asivikelane, but the three red lights paint a dire picture of service delivery in that municipality.

### GOOD NEWS

- Taps in Sinethemba in Mossel Bay were repaired.
- Residents from Witzenberg said that after their meeting with municipal officials, some settlements received plastic refuse bags, while one settlement will get an additional refuse skip.
